Three Cheyenne County Businesses Fail Recent Compliance Checks

The Nebraska State Patrol conducted checks of underage tobacco compliance as part of the Tobacco Free in the Panhandles comprehensive plan to keep youth from starting to use tobacco products. Officers with the assistance of youth under the age of 18 checked 12 convenience stores, grocery stores and liquor stores throughout Cheyenne County in August. Of the 12 establishments, 9 did not sell tobacco to the underage person. However, three businesses did sell them tobacco.

The businesses that failed were:

- Bag's Bar, 940 Front St, Potter.
- Sonny's Super Foods, 2020 10th St, Sidney. Second fail in 12 months.
- Family Dollar, 1608 10th Ave, Sidney.

The Panhandle Prevention Coalition congratulates the following businesses and employees for not selling tobacco to the underage person and encourages you to support these businesses: Big V's in Dalton, Git'n Spit, Shamrock BP Amoco, Two J's too, Wal-Mart, Western C-Store, Wilkinson Sidney Conoco, Sapp Brothers, Smoker Friendly all of Sidney.

"A failure rate of 25% raises concerns showing us there continues to be a need for education and training," stated Tabi Prochazka, Tobacco Free in the Panhandle Coordinator. "Research shows that when communities consistently conduct compliance checks and keep failure rates below 10%, children in those communities are less likely to use tobacco products."

Training for alcohol and tobacco retailers is available quarterly at locations throughout the Panhandle. This training, sponsored by Panhandle Prevention Coalition and Nebraska State Patrol, provides individuals entrusted with the responsibility of serving alcohol or selling tobacco with strategies to avoid illegally selling to underage youth or intoxicated patrons. Responsible Beverage Server Training is available for free to retail merchants, owners, and employees across the Panhandle. The next training is on September 23rd.
