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## *Nonprofit leadership training offered in Alliance*

Nonprofits are held to a very high level of accountability – to their funders, their board and their staff – but still must operate on a shoestring budget. Even with a paid director, the nonprofit has different needs than the usual for profit business on Main Street. A series of one-day workshops will be offered in Alliance to address the leadership needs of the small Panhandle nonprofit agency.

The six modules, taught by the Nonprofit Leadership institute and offered by the Panhandle Partnership Training Academy, begin Wednesday, July 7 at Box Butte General Hospital's Sandhills Room in the Medical Arts Plaza. The trainings will continue every other Wednesday through September 15, with a different topic for each date. The dates and topics are:

- *Foundations of Leadership*                      *July 7*
- *Leading the Nonprofit Board*                      *July 21*
- *Effective Strategic Planning*                      *August 4*
- *Outcomes Management and Evaluation*                      *August 18*
- *Reporting and Managing Finances*                      *September 1*
- *Human Resource Management*                      *September 15*

The fee for the trainings is \$126 with a discount offered, if registering and paying for all six trainings in advance. The fee includes all materials, meals and snacks. Certificates of completion will be available upon request.

The objectives of the courses are to strengthen leadership and management skills for the current and future generations of nonprofit leaders, to build skills in everything from day-to-day financial and personnel management to high-level leadership and to provide skills needed to run a successful organization.
