How does Healthy Families America Improve Outcomes?

Reduction in Child Maltreatment.

Studies have found maltreatment in HFA families to be much lower than the national average of 4.7%, in some cases it is as low as 0%.

Decrease in Low Birth Weights.

HFA babies have fewer birth complications and higher birth weights than comparison groups.

Increased Frequency of Breast-feeding.

HFA mothers breast-feed significantly longer than comparison groups.

Enhanced Child Development Knowledge.

HFA parents report 87% improvement in knowledge of infant care.

Linkages to Medical Home.

HFA facilitates access to preventative and routine health care including immunizations and well-baby check-ups.

How does Healthy Families America Assure Quality Services?

HFA-Nebraska Panhandle is managed by a Registered Nurse. All staff receive highly specialized training upon employment and on an on-going basis to assure fidelity of the program is maintained. HFA site accreditation is granted to sites based upon a stringent set of 12 critical elements founded in 20 vears of research. The process involves an indepth examination of each site's operation, as well as the quality of the home visit services being provided.

The American Academy of Pediatrics Formal Policy Statement on Home Visitations:

Home-visiting programs offer a mechanism for ensuring that at-risk families have social support, linkage with public and private community services, and ongoing health, developmental, and safety education. When these services are part of a system of high-quality well-child care linked or integrated with the pediatric medical home, they have the potential to mitigate health and developmental outcome disparities.
