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Driven to Inspire

Motivational speaker will share critical message of highway safety, positive choices, and leadership at upcoming assembly series at multiple Panhandle schools.

Panhandle Public Health District and Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) Highway Safety Office are offering school assemblies to four Panhandle middle and high schools on November 6th and 7th. Cara Filler will provide education and awareness around the importance of highway safety, positive choices, and leadership.

Filler watched her identical twin sister, Mairin, die in a speed-related car crash the day after their 18th birthday and the summer before their graduation from high school. Since Mairin's death, Filler has spoken to more than 2 million students and parents worldwide. During her talk she will provide powerful takeaways that offer real-life tips for building resilience, becoming an impactful leader, and making positive choices while navigating the “roadtrip” of school.

Our school is fairly small, but some days I can't fathom all the heartbreak and difficult things our students are dealing with. Your presentation was a gift. So, thank you!”

PPHD is working with local and statewide organizations to increase access to Driver's Ed. Only 20% of Panhandle teens take Driver's Ed courses compared to the state average of 50%. Driver's Ed reduces crashes and traffic tickets enhancing individual and community safety.
