## The Nebraska Panhandle needs increased access to Driver's Ed

We all know the importance of driving safely on our Panhandle streets and highways. All Panhandle residents can help with this effort in many ways. One area of focus is around teen education. Only 20% of Panhandle teens take Driver's Education courses compared to the state average of 50%. Driver's Education reduces crashes and traffic tickets enhancing individual and community safety.
