Vaccination is one of the best ways to prevent severe illness from respiratory viruses. As fall and winter arrive, so does the season when respiratory viruses are most active. Vaccination remains one of the most effective tools to prevent severe illness, hospitalization, and complications.

# Respiratory Season Vaccine Information

	Influenza (Flu) Vaccine	Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)  Immunization  Prevention options include  vaccination and monoclonal  antibody therapy.	COVID-19	Pneumonia
Who should get it:	Annual vaccination is recommended for everyone 6 months and older, unless medically contraindicated.     High-dose flu vaccines, designed for older adults, are available.	Vaccines, if vaccinated in a previous season, there is no current recommendation for a booster dose this season.  Recommended for adults 75 years and older.  Recommended for adults ages 50–74 with risk factors.  Recommended for pregnant women during weeks 32–36 of pregnancy to help protect newborns.  Monoclonal Antibody Therapies Nirsevimab and Clesrovimab are available to protect infants and young children.  Recommended for all babies born to mothers who did not receive the maternal RSV vaccine.  Recommended for children 8–19 months who are at higher risk of severe RSV disease.	• Available for everyone 6 months through 64 years after risk and benefits discussion with clinician. • Recommended for adults 65 years and older.	Recommended for adults 50 and older and for younger adults with certain health conditions.
How well do they work:	Reduces risk of going to the doctor by 30– 60%	Reduces risk of severe disease by 80–96%	30–60% additional protection against illness & severe disease	Covers approximately 84– 85% of invasive pneumococcal disease
When should I get it:	October is ideal, available throughout flu season	Infants: Oct–Mar Pregnancy: Sept–Jan Older Adults: Get it now, available year-round	Get it now. Recently infected? Wait at least 6 months.	Get it now, available year- round
